


#### Civil Society in the Czech Republic

- Shrinking space for civil society
- Stigmatization of civil society in the public sphere
- Focus on professionalization and services
- Limited citizen participation in democratic affairs and policy processes
- Lack of available resources for capacity development of CSOs



### Challenges for Civil Society Organisations (CSOs)

- To formulate their goals and communicate their activities well enough to gain public as well as donor support
- To reinforce partnership between civil society organizations and public institutions
- To work more on constituency building




#### The Active Citizens Fund






#### Programme Outcomes

- Increased capacity and sustainability of the civil society sector and CSOs organizational capacity


15% of regranting allocated to capacity development and sustainability of CSOs

- To strengthen advocacy and watchdog activities of civil society
- To reinforce partnership between civil society organizations and public institutions











## Open Society Fund Prague

Supports the development of an open society and promotes systemic changes that help to strengthen democracy in the Czech Republic.



#### Open Society Fund Prague (leader)

- Was founded in 1992 as one of the first grant-making institutions in the Czech Republic
- Introduced numerous new concepts to the Czech Republic (a palliative care, watchdog organizations, an inclusive education)
- Promotes NGO cooperation and networking
- Encourages NGOs, civic initiatives, and individuals to actively influence conditions in their region
- More than 1.38 billion Czech crowns (over EUR 53 million) for more than 9,400 projects





Organizations that aim at dignified inclusion of people with handicap,


abandoned children, ill and elderly citizens.



# Committee of Good Will – Olga Havel Foundation (partner)

- Was founded 28 years ago by Olga Havlová, the first wife of president Václav Havel
- Supports several hundred NGOs (social inclusion, healthcare, human rights) and more than 1 000 disadvantaged individuals every year
- Joins the activities to enhance legislation that would lead to better social and healthcare services and protection of human rights
- Multiannual scholarships for 460 physically or socially handicapped students were given
- Enabled **800 doctors** of all specializations to participate in top medical seminars in Austria

• Distributed contributions in the amount of CZK 750,000,000 (30 mil EUR)





Our mission is personal development of young people in the spirit of these values.






